



- My husband with the "robot" t-shirt I made him. This stencil took a long time to make.
- The circle shapes were made by laying quarters on the shirt.
- After positioning the stencil (made from a sheet of newspaper), I covered the rest of the shirt with newspaper to protect it from stray bleach spray.

- The cut-outs for this shirt took only a few minutes, and then I just laid them around on the shirt.
- The paper will be destroyed in the process, so it doesn't need to look pretty. I used newspaper ads & scotch tape to create these shapes.
- Layering made the design interesting, but remember that only the "shadow" of the design will remain, so don't cover over too many of the unique details.
